BACKGROUND TO OUR HEROES

QUEEN HIMIKO OF YAMATAI (3RD CENTURY)

The first named Japanese person in written history.

Queen Himiko was an unmarried shamaness chosen to rule after a period of political and violent turmoil. She restored peace to the land for the next 50 years. The historical Chinese document, 'The History of the Kingdom of Wei' (297AD) was the first written source about Japan that recorded Himiko as the first Japanese name in history.

Himiko's legacy was largely erased until the 17th Century. Scholars ascribe this to the Japanese ruling elite in the centuries after Himiko trying to emulate patriarchal Chinese ideals of the period.

TOMOE GOZEN (12TH CENTURY)

The most famous female samurai warrior in Japanese history.

Tomoe lived through the Genpei Civil War (1180-1185) where two families (the Taira and Minamoto clans) fought and laid waste to the then capital, Kyoto and the surrounding countryside.

Tomoe was a leading commander for the Minamoto clan. Highlights of her career include collecting the heads of seven mounted warriors; leading over 1000 cavalry to victory; leading a force of 300 against 6000 Taira and surviving a battle as 1 of 5 Minamoto clan survivors.

RAICHO HIRATSUKA (1886-1971)

Founding editor of landmark feminist magazine, Seito.

Raicho Hiratuka was a journalist, political activist and pioneering feminist. Raicho and her team launched the first issue of Seito in 1911. Seito was a radical, rule breaking publication that was banned in girls' schools. Later, the government destroyed copies to silence them, however their influence had already spread.

NOE ITO (1895-1923)

Editor in chief at Seito magazine.

In 1915, Noe Ito took over the editorship of Seito magazine from Raicho Hiratsuka. Noe was a precocious writer and political activist. Under her leadership, Seito became a more radical, anarchic publication and the

government banned five issues. Ito also translated the works of one of history's most famous anarcho-feminists, Emma Goldman, which is what led Noe to become one of the leading figures in Japanese anarchism.
